A New Worship Centre

In October 1982 Vestry signed a contract with Chapelstone Developers for working drawings of a new building. The building was designed under Rev. Hiscock's directive that 'The prime objective is to have a building that will speak to young families in the community'.

By April 1983 demolition of the old Virginia Waters School building was completed. Vestry had accepted a proposal by Randy and Jim Young to 'take down' the building for use of the wood.

Clearing of the site for the new church building began in May 1983.

The dream of a worship centre for the Northeast area of St. John's became a reality on December 24, 1983, when the first service was held in the new church.

By January the entire church complex was completed and St. Mark the Evangelist Church was dedicated on January 29, 1984, by The Right Reverend Martin Mate, assisted by Rev. Charles Hiscock and Rev. F. W. Peacock.

Over the next thirteen years many groups, committees, organizations and individuals within the parish participated in numerous fund raising projects to eliminate the debt on the new building. St. Mark the Evangelist Church was consecrated on December 21, 1997, by The Right Reverend Donald Harvey.
