THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Within our parishes today, the liturgical colour has changed from green to purple because we have begun our Lenten journey, a journey marked by penitence and simplicity. In Lent, we are called to "self-examination, penitence, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and by reading and meditating on the word of God." (B.A.S., 282). All of this is in preparation for our celebration of our Lord's passion and resurrection at Eastertide.

Within the Holy Eucharist during Lent, greater emphasis is placed upon penitence. In the gathering, we pray 'Lord, have mercy' as we reflect upon God's nature and our dependence upon our Creator God. In the prayers of the people, we pray 'in your mercy, hear us," as we remember our needs and those of the world. In the confession and absolution, we call to mind what mars our humanity and challenges our life in the kingdom of God, and we pray, "Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us." We repeat this again and again today and during our Lenten journey. We keep before us the need of repentance and yet, before the liturgy concludes, in the blessing, we are assured that God is gracious. God both forgives us and accepts us, speaking "words of pardon and peace." All is not lost!
