SUPPORTING ST. MARK'S THROUGH E-GIVING

Over the month of February we will be focusing on e-giving. As you may or may not know you can give to St. Mark's through direct debit, Visa and MasterCard. We currently have about 180 contributors who give using one of these methods. We have set a goal to increase this number to 200, which represents 50% of the parish using some form of e-giving. Because we take financial management very seriously, we have negotiated a contract with a new merchant services provider. This will mean both lower service charges (more money stays with the parish) and added security for your personal information. The Worship and Program Committee formed on May 11 was chaired by Norman Oldford; Charles Cook was Vice-Chairman; Bunty Severs, Secretary; David Sheppard, Treasurer; Tolson Barrington, Youth Coordinator.

First service was 10:00 a.m. Holy Eucharist at Virginia Park School on May 22, with a congregation of 130. There were 70 communicants.

On December 24 a congregation of 380 attended the first Christmas celebration for the parish.

The cross for the altar came from Christ Church in Quidi Vidi Village.

The first service of Holy Baptism was held July 31. Two babies were baptised.

Bob Caravan became the first permanent organist.

The Annual Report for the year noted 100 families in the parish.
