BIBLE STUDY - FEBRUARY 2017

During February The Rev. Dr. Alex Faseruk will conduct a study of the Epistle to the Galatians, often referred to as simply Galatians. It is the ninth book of the New Testament and was written by the Apostle Paul to the early Christian community in Galatia. Paul's concern is primarily with the controversy surrounding Gentile Christians and Mosaic Law during the Apostolic Age. He argues that Gentile Christians do not need to adhere to the tenets of the Mosaic Law by contextualizing the role of the Law in the light of the revelation of Christ. Galatians is an important book that has exerted enormous influence on the history of Christianity, the development of Christian theology, and the study of the Apostle Paul. The study will be conducted on four consecutive Wednesdays (February 1, 8, 15 and 22) from 1:30 - 3:00 p.m. at St. Mark's.
