

<u>The Passion with the Liturgy of the Palms</u> Saturday, March 19, at 5:00 p.m. Sunday, March 20, at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Today Jesus entered the Holy City of Jerusalem in triumph. His path was lined with palms and shouts of praise but lead to self-giving, suffering and death.

Stations of the Cross Tuesday, March 22, at 7:30 p.m. Walking around the church, we stop at fourteen stations to reflect upon various points of our Lord's Passion and death.

Thursday, March 24, at 7:30 p.m. - Maundy Thursday worship On the night before his death Jesus set an example for his disciples by washing their feet, an act of humble service. Foot washing is done in the context of the Eucharist. The altar is stripped in preparation for Good Friday.

9:00 p.m. to midnight – Gethsemane Watch Jesus said to them, "Why are you sleeping? Get up and pray that you may not come into the time of trial."

Friday, March 25, at 9:30 a.m. - Children's Liturgy 12:00 noon - The Celebration of the Lord's Passion A time to remember the great price Jesus paid as he willingly stretched his arms on the cross for those he loved.

Saturday, March 26, at 7:30 p.m.


This is the first service of Easter and includes the Service of Light, the Renewal of Baptismal Vows (possibly a Baptism) and Holy Eucharist.

A NOTE FROM THE ANGLICAN HOSPITAL CHAPLAINCY

If you are admitted to hospital you should be asked by admitting if you would like the services of Pastoral Care. If you say "Yes" you will sign a consent form and the chaplain will see you within 24 hours. If you decline pastoral care and later change your mind, have a nurse call the chaplain. You will be asked to sign a consent form and the chaplain will visit. Please note that due to confidentiality the chaplains can only contact your parish priest with your permission.
