Blessing Bags for the homeless in partnership with The Gathering Place

Goal: To fill 50 large ziploc bags with essential everyday items

A Home for St. Mark's

The decision was made at the June 1978 Vestry meeting to purchase the Virginia Waters School, with its four portables.

In September 1978 St. Mark's was given parish status with The Reverend Charles Hiscock inducted as first Rector.

In January 1980 the Women's Organization suggested to Vestry that a building fund be started. By September Vestry had sought permission to do so.

By October 1981 Synod had approved construction of a new church building for St. Mark's. Estimated cost in 1982 was \$583,400. At the time there was \$50,000 cash in the building fund.

Construction began with the unveiling of the cornerstone May 15, 1983, on the site of the Virginia Waters School.

Funds were raised through loans from several city churches and Synod, pledges by individuals, donations to a memorial fund and fundraising events in the parish.

The first service was held in the new church building December 24, 1983.
